Year 10 - Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education Programme (PSHE) Update

As part of your child's education at King's Academy Easthampstead Park (KAEP), we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education Programme (PSHE). PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitude and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

Over the next term, your child's class will be taking part in lessons which will focus on British Values, preparing learners for future success, promoting healthy relationships, acting responsibly and staying healthy (both financially, mentally and physically) and developing character and building resilience.

Students will also have the opportunity to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world.

PSHE is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. Topics to be covered this year include:
