We also have support from external visitors, who provide them with many opportunities to improve their understanding, which has a positive effect on their grades. Students should attempt to answer practice questions and revise core content in all their subjects at home. A 'How to Revise' revision booklet has been given to every student to support their work at home.

According to The Student Room, students revise 15 to 20 hours per week for their exams, which might sound like a lot until you break it down. You've probably worked it out for yourself, but the recommended time equates to three to five hours of revision per day with weekends off! But typically, students spread their practice and revision across 7 days and around commitments.

We understand that every student is an individual, and therefore, rates of progression vary from one individual to another. This will be a great opportunity for you to liaise with your sons/daughters' subject teachers to find out what progress they are making.



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Furthermore, it is a way to discuss your child's strengths, areas for improvement in each subject, and what they can do to be as successful as possible at GCSE. With a limited amount of time, we all need to do what we can to ensure that every child reaches their full potential at GCSE and has the best start to the next chapter of their lives. We want to ensure that students **Believe** in their abilities to **Achieve** their aspirations.

On the Evening

Access into the school is via the lower school playground, where parking is also available. There is no access via the main school reception due to our security system.

On arrival, please come in to the Library where the sign in forms will be located, with departments holding appointments in the classrooms off the Humanities corridor. Refreshments and snacks will be available from the prom committee if you would like to purchase to raise funds.

The school uses an intuitive and easy-to-use online appointment booking system, Parents' Evening. This system allows you to choose your own appointment times with teachers, and you will receive an email confirming your appointments.
